Join Amador RCD January 9th to learn more about **financial resources and free technical assistance available to farmers and ranchers in Amador, Calaveras, Alpine and Tuolumne Counties.** The statewide California Department of Food and Agriculture Healthy Soils Incentives

Program is expected to fund \$11 million direct-to-farmer grants. The application period is anticipated to open in January 2024. The Central Sierra Healthy Soils Program, a joint initiative of Placer RCD, Amador RCD, and El Dorado/Georgetown Divide RCD, has an additional \$3.4 million available for direct-to-farmer grants for agricultural operators in the Central Sierra region. Amador RCD is available to help farmers and ranchers develop projects and submit applications.
