1. Approval of 9/8/22 Minutes. Board Action – **K. Lambert made motion to approve, second by J. Marsili. On a 4-1-1 vote, minutes were approved.** (Hafley abstained.)
2. Approval of Sept/Oct 2022 Finance Reports – **K. Lambert made motion to approve, second by J. Marsili. On a 4-1-1 vote, financials were approved.** (Hafley abstained.)

Old Business:

1. Update on Murphys to Forest Meadows – G. Long reported that we are still waiting on payment from CalFire but he is in communication with them. Two Contractors are ready to return to work.
Forest Meadows to Wylderidge – L. Plautz reported work is scheduled to start in December.
Pine Ridge – K. Dillashaw reported the RFP for a Forester has been sent out.
Fricot City-Highway 108 – G. Long reported he walked the project. CEQA is ready. A couple of acres have been removed due to lack of access.
Pine Mountain Lake – Most of the ROEs have been returned. RFP will go out soon.
Moke Hill – G. Long reported he received the contract and will move on to the next steps.
Bummerville/Blizzard Mine – G. Long reported working on Project Manager job description (see NB 4).

Position Summary

The Project Manager position for the Bummerville/Blizzard Mine Fuels Reduction and Forest Restoration Project is part-time and temporary. The position is specific to the project described in this notice. The Project Manager will accomplish work on the project, as described in duties below. This position will be terminated when the project is considered complete and/or reaches the contract end date of 10/01/2027.

Duties

- Coordination and administration of a 460-acre mechanical vegetation project that will include commercial logging, mastication, and hand work.
- Engage with Bureau of Land Management (BLM) staff, landowners, and contractors, to ensure project specifications are met.
- Responsible for invoicing and reporting of work progress to RCD staff.

Minimum Requirements

- Experience working with federal land management partners.
- Experience with policies, regulations, and reporting procedures for Sierra Nevada Conservancy forestry grants.
- Minimum 1-2 years' experience managing mechanical vegetation treatment projects in a forest setting.

Additional Requirements

- Valid California Driver's License.
- Ability to communicate on a telephone, via email, and in person.

- The position requires significant field work in a forest setting. This requires:
 - Ability to climb, bend, stoop, squat, and reach on a frequent basis.
 - Ability to hike over rough terrain for long periods in possible inclement weather.
 - Ability to properly prepare and endure for long hours exposed to the elements.
